Courses, Requirements, and 2019-2020 Schedule

The South Asian Studies Minor is an interdisciplinary minor that incorporates courses from various departments that center the cultural, economic, and political processes occurring in and out of South Asia. By approaching this region, which includes the countries of Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Bhutan, India, Maldives, Nepal, Pakistan and Sri Lanka, from diverse perspectives, the South Asian Studies minor allows students to integrate a regional specialization into their program of study. The purpose of this minor is to understand the interconnectedness of the world and the position of South Asia in multiple nodes of connection.

MINOR REQUIREMENTS

Up to two upper-division courses may overlap with courses taken for a major.

The minor consists of seven courses, of which at least five must be upper-division.

No more than two courses (eight units) may be taken with a pass/no pass grade.

At least three courses must be completed from the "core" list with 75-100% South Asia content.

The remaining up to four courses may be chosen from the electives list with 25-50% South Asia content.
